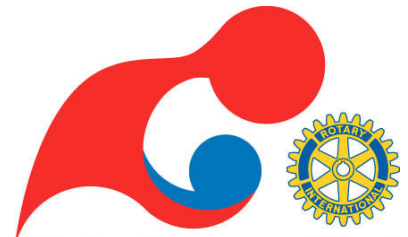

Today's speakers were Bill Hadley, the Director of the Lexington Public Works, and Mike Lawrence, head of the design team for HKT Architects and Engineers who designed the new DPW facility in Lexington. Bill gave a brief history of the project. Bill and Mike together presented various pictures of the new facility and described some of its amazing features. It truly is a facility we can all take pride in for its environmental efficiency and its functional excellence. As many as 60 vehicles can be housed inside. Storm water is stored in a 5,000 gallon tank and can be reused washing vehicles and filling street sweepers. Storm runoff is collected in giant tubes under the pavement where it is allowed to slowly dissipate rather than create flash floods. The whole layout has been designed to have no vehicle back up noise (beeping) to disturb neighbors. Idling is kept to a minimum. Vehicles pull forward through the salt/sand loading. Efficient design solutions have been employed wherever possible.

Don't forget, there will a \$20 fine for anyone who does not participate in the Patriot's Day fundraising effort., Monday, April 20th.
