Lexington Spoke, January 25th, 2010

It was a dark and stormy day when we last gathered at Palio's for our Monday lunch. President Doug announced that January is Rotary Awareness Month and highlighted the Polio Now Program where worldwide there were only 1454 new cases of polio in the past year. Bill Gates' pledge of \$355 million to this program has been instrumental in enabling Rotary to vaccinate 2.3 million children in a single day.

President Doug announced that the World Peace and Understanding dinner is coming up on February 9th at the Danversport Yacht Club, starting at 6:00 p.m. Also to be put on the calendar is the District Conference, May 21-23 at the Samoset Resort in Rockport, ME, and the Rotary International Conference in Montreal in June. Also in June, Jim Shaw reminded us, we will again be having Comedy Night as one of our major fund raisers.

With the earthquake in Haiti on everyone's minds, President Doug informed us that our club will be sponsoring a ShelterBox or two. ShelterBox is a tent and basic living tools contained in one easily shipped plastic container, a concept developed early this decade by a Rotarian in the UK. What's in a Shelterbox? According to www.shelterboxusa.org:

"Shelterboxes are usually packed with one (sometimes two) ten-person tent(s). Other items can include insulated sleeping mats and thermal blankets, water purification tablets, water purification kits, water containers/carriers, a trenching shovel, a multi-fueled cook stove, eating utensils and plates, a childrens' activity kit and other essential items."

It was with mixed feelings – sadness for us, happiness for PP Jack – that President Doug informed us of PP Jack's decision to move south. He wouldn't tell us where, but stated that it was 50 miles north of Orlando. PP Jack served faithfully for 13 uninterrupted years as Secretary. He will be greatly missed and we hope we hear regular updates of his retired life and escapades.
